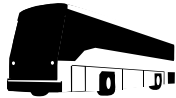
Family Support Services

The Family Support Services Department provides a comprehensive, seamless system to assist low-income families to live self-sufficient, quality lives.



Community Service Block Grant is funded by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services; providing comprehensive support to families experiencing chronic financial crisis, and who demonstrate a commitment to overcoming barriers to achieve a higher quality of life:

- Food vouchers
- Bus passes or gas vouchers
- Transportation
- Rental, and Utility Deposit assistance
- Mortgage assistance
- Prescriptions
- Referral and other case management services



This program serves Leon, Calhoun, Franklin, Gadsden, Jefferson, and Liberty counties.

On the Job Training identifies specific employability skills and deficiencies by working closely with enrollees through our 90-day program.

- Part-time employment at our agency for development of skills for the first 30 days
- Resume creation and job seeking for the next 30 days
- Placement with one of our business partners for hopeful permanent employment for the final 30 days

Micro-Enterprise Small Business Development assists clients with special skills and motivation to start their own business.

- Up to \$3,000 loan
- Assistance with financial and marketing plans
- Marketing kit including: logo design, letterhead, stationary, business cards, flyer design, and one ad design for their local newspaper

Individual Development Accounts encourages an attitude of savings; allowing for up to \$2,000 match.

- The home ownership goal is eligible for a four-to-one match
- Micro-enterprise expansion or post-secondary education expenses are eligible for a two-to-one match

Emergency Services

Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program assists low-income households in meeting the costs of utility payments and crisis assistance.

- Priority is given to households with elderly, disabled, or children under 5 years of age
- Benefit amount is based on National Poverty guidelines

This program serves Leon, Calhoun, Franklin, Gadsden, Gulf, Jefferson, and Liberty counties.

Project Share is funded by the City of Tallahassee providing utility payment and deposit assistance to City of Tallahassee customers meeting the following requirements:



- 60 years old or older
- Documented medical conditions and/or disabilities
- Loss of income due to injury or illness

Project Quincy is funded by the City of Quincy provides emergency utility assistance to City of Quincy utility customers meeting following:



- 60 years old or older
- Documented medical conditions and/or disabilities
- Loss of income due to injury or illness

Direct Emergency Assistance Program is funded by Leon County for households experiencing a crisis.

- Rent and utility payment/deposit
- Prescription
- Transportation
- Food assistance



Weatherization Program makes repairs to ensure energy efficient and safe housing for low-income individuals and families, particularly the elderly, the disabled, and families with children.

This program serves Gadsden, Franklin, Jefferson and Gulf counties.

Emergency Food Assistance Program

distributes USDA food commodities to eligible individuals and families on a monthly basis.



This program serves Leon, Liberty, Calhoun, Jefferson, and Franklin counties.

Emergency Shelter Program provides short term and immediate assistance to homeless individuals, families, or those that might otherwise need emergency temporary shelter.

This program serves Leon county only.

Head Start

At Head Start it is our mission for children and families to become self-sufficient through the provision of comprehensive services which empower them socially, emotionally, economically, and physically.



Head Start Program is a free child and family development program for low-income families with preschoolers, ages three and four. This program provides the following services:

- Comprehensive readiness program
- Hearing and vision screenings
- Nutritious meals
- Health and dental care
- Family services referrals
- Seminars and trainings for parents

This program serves Leon, Jefferson, and Franklin counties.
